Red Oak BBB nets three wins

The Red Oak Tigers began a new streak over Atlantic with the 64-61 overtime win on Tuesday, Feb. 1. Last month the Tigers ended a 31-game losing streak against the Trojans, and have turned it around, earning the regular season sweep.

Both teams got off to a slow start with the first half ending in a 17-15 lead for Red Oak. The Tigers came out hot after the break, draining eight triples of the first nine baskets made, pulling away 43-34 early in the fourth quarter. Atlantic battled back and took the lead on a Trojan steal and dunk with less than a minute to play. The Tigers tied the game up with four seconds left to send the game into overtime.

In overtime, the Tigers took an early lead and were able to withstand a late Trojan run for the win. "It's incredibly tough to beat a conference team twice in a year, so we knew tonight was going to be a battle," Red Oak head boys basketball coach Spencer Plank said. "We didn't play our best game, but we made enough winning plays down the stretch. I'm proud of the effort and fight we showed tonight."

The Montgomery County Board of Supervisors met in quorum, Tuesday, January 25, 2022, at 8:30 a.m. at the courthouse for their regular meeting.

The meeting was called to order by Chair Mark Peterson. There was a roll call of members with Supervisors Randy Cooper, Mike Olson, Mark Peterson, Donna Robinson and Charla Schmid present.

Motion to approve the agenda by Olson, second by Schmid. Roll call: Yes: Cooper, Olson, Peterson, Robinson, Schmid. No: None. Motion carried.

Minutes of the January 18, 2022, regular meeting and January 18, 2022, budget work session were approved and stand as read.

The Chairman called for public comments. Jan Norris was present via zoom. She thanked the Board for appointing her to the Eminent Domain Commission. She also addressed her concern with the potential pipeline project.

Under Supervisor's updates, Robinson attended a Montgomery County Safety meeting. Schmid attended the state audit exit interview with Auditor Burke and a local Iowa Workforce Development meeting. Cooper attended a MCDC Housing Committee meeting. Peterson attended a Golden Hills RCSD meeting and a Conservation meeting.

Martha Herzberg was present and gave an annual update of the Villisca Public Library and asked for a funding request in the amount of \$8,134 which amounts to a 5.5% - 6% increase from this fiscal year.

Ann Carder and Steve Adams from the Montgomery County Development Corporation were present and gave a MCDC update.

Supervisor Cooper left the meeting at 9:25 a.m.

Under Secondary Roads update, Engineer Karen Albert was present and gave a project and maintenance update.

Under new business, there was discussion regarding three open insurance claims from hail damage to county buildings. Damien Bond informed the Board that he received

quotes to fix a county shed. Engineer Albert stated that there is a concrete county shed that had minimal damage and she does not plan on repairing that county building. 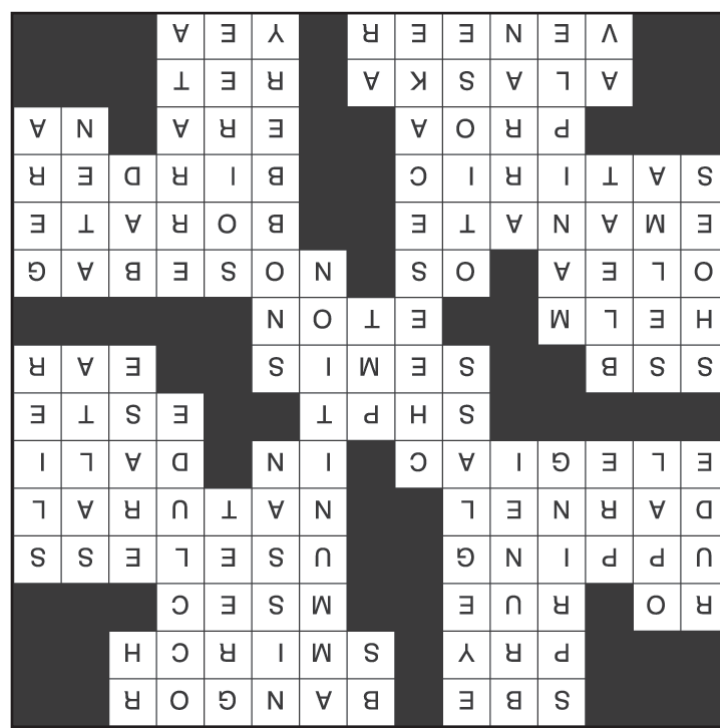

The Board discussed various aspects of the FY22/23 Montgomery County budget, including department expenses, revenues, and levies.

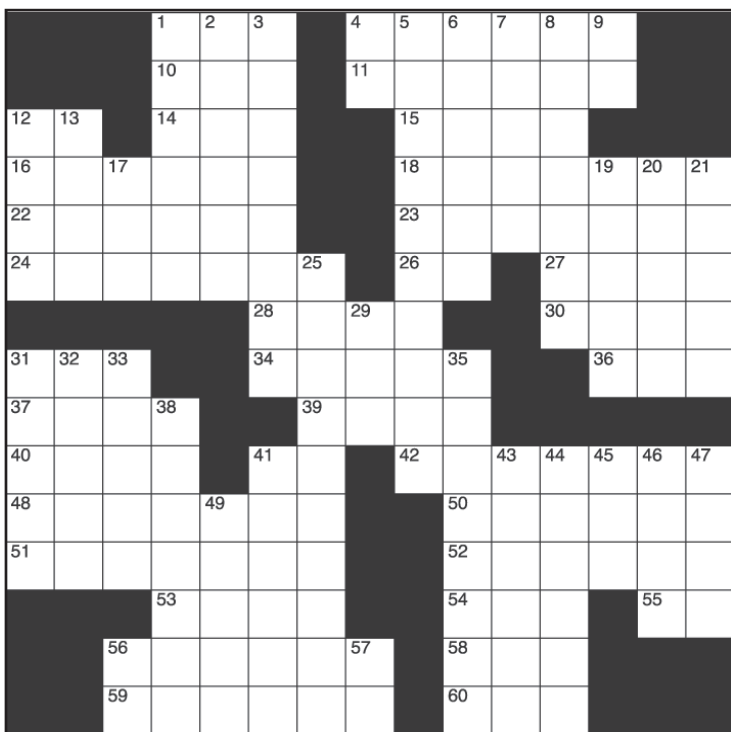
