### Stanton track teams find strength in numbers

The Stanton track teams grew in numbers this season, with the girls team almost doubling in size from the seven who made up the roster last year.

"We've got a good bunch of girls out this season," Stanton girls head track coach Bruce Subbert said. "Hopefully we can win a few more events this year."

Returning for the Queens is Carly Roberts who won the conference 3000m last season in 13:20.08, over a minute faster than the rest of the field. She finished third at the conference meet in the 1500m with a 5:59.19. She anchored the distance medley relay and will be the number one long distance returning runner in the conference.

The Viqueens return sprinters Addi Olson, Brooklyn Silva, and Elly McDonald. Kyla Hart is a freshman who excelled in junior high last season, and the addition of her speed will be used to help fill the gap left by Tara Peterson. The freshmen were part of a group who set records and had a stellar season a year ago, and they are expected to be big contributors from the get go. The 4X200 relay won at all but one

meet and the mix of Hart, Ella Johnson, Lauren Johnson, and Hannah Olson set a new school record in the event.

The field events were led by Jenna Stephens last season for the Queens, and she returns to throw both shot put and discus. Freshman H. Olson won the shot put event as an eighth-grader and has experienced varsity level competition already this year, adding good depth to the field events. Riley Burke and Lauren Johnson might be tossed into the jumping events, as both excelled in junior high a year ago, also.

McDonald returns to the hurdles this season and may have enough freshmen to join her in a relay, giving Stanton another chance to score points.

The Vikings return 10 athletes from a year ago and have added 15 to their roster.

Seniors Logan Roberts and Jack Roberts are both returning state competitors from a year ago.

L. Roberts ran the open 400m, finishing in 17th place at the state meet, with a time of 52.94, and is expected to lead the sprinters again this season. Other returning sprinters include J. Roberts, Josh Martin, and Nolan Grebin

J. Roberts medaled in the high jump,

setting a new school record in the process recording a 6-03 jump. He had struggled with a knee injury throughout the season and only competed in the high jump in three meets. Hopefully, his final season will be injury free, and expectations are high for him in this event. Tristan Frank finished third in the conference in the discus and will be looking to improve his placing in both

throwing events this season.

Levi Martin led the mile runners at the conference meet, finishing in 5:32.30 for first. He brings back mid/long distance runners Preston Carpenter, Evan Hopf, and Jonan Wookey, who are ready to up their game with a season under their belts.

Upperclassmen who have joined the mix after not competing last season include Carter Johnson, Kyle Pastore, and Quentin Thornburg. All three athletes will be a huge addition to the program.

Freshmen who are expected to make an immediate impact include Gavin Ford, Evan Gettler, and Simon Showalter. The three had successful junior high careers and have already competed on the varsity level in other sports this year.

"With the depth of the roster, we have a chance to play around with events," Stanton head boys track coach Jeff Grebin said. "We can make an impact at the meets this season."

The Stanton Viqueens compete tomorrow in Red Oak at the girls track meet beginning at 4 p.m. The Vikings compete on Friday, April 8, at the Cardinal Relays in Clarinda at 4 p.m.

two golfers, Caleb Oakleaf and Kamron Brownlee.



Caleb Oakleaf is the top returning boys golfer from a year ago. (Charm Carpenter/ The Red Oak Express)







Mark Kells is back as head coach for the team, entering his fourth year of coaching for the program he helped get started in 2019.


The Tigers bring back some experienced players as a dozen return for another year.

Scheduling has been an issue again this season, but the Tigers have five games set up so far, and are looking to add more if they can.


Three seniors have been playing since the program began: Patrick Holste, Jazmyn Perez, and Alex Vera. They will be expected to be the leaders of the team.

The Essex track teams have started the season with great results already. Both teams competed at an indoor meet in Pella mid March and senior Riley Jensen came home with a first-place medal and a new school record. She won the high jump with

Racine and Resh led the sprinters while Nelson, Racine, Resh, and Staley also led the field events. Givens and Hall were the mid-distance runners last year.


The Trojans just had 10 athletes on the team last year, and focused on the individual



The Red Oak girls golf team finished fifth as a team in the Class 2A second-round finals in Neola last season. With only four exiting the program, the Tigers are excited for the season.

Allie Allison, Payten Bass, Ashlyn Blackman, and Lennon O'Neal are the returning seniors and are expected to lead the girls team this season.

Bass averaged 51 on nine holes to lead the team, followed by Allison's 54, O'Neal's 58, and Blackman's 64.

Lexi Meier averaged 64 last season as a sophomore and classmate Estephany Medina averaged 72. Hannah Smith debuted on the links a year ago, finishing with a 68 average and will be needed to replace some of the exiting seniors.

Grayson Hewitt and Truman Stickland return for their final year on the links on the boys side. Hewitt averaged a 61 on nine holes last season.

Cyrus Mensen debuted last season on the links and averaged a 52 to lead those returning. Others returning are Tyler Beeson and Sam Fields, who averaged 58 and 55, respectively.

The Tigers were a young team last season and ended their season seventh in the Class 2A first round sectional.

"We are calling this the rebirth of the program," Red Oak head boys golf coach Bob Boeye said last season. "We hope to get some pride back in the Tiger golf program."

With the young team gaining valuable varsity experience last season, that pride shows, and the team looks for a deeper post season run.



Bruce finished 24th in the Class 1A long jump with





On the girls' side, the team is mostly freshmen with a couple upperclassmen sprinkled in.



Kaden Johnson competed in the open 400m and finished in 19th place in Class 2A.





The girls gained valuable experience last season and hope to build on that this season, according to Southwest Valley head golf coach Cindy Drake.



# East Mills track teams loaded with potential

Lots of potential and lots of question marks.

That's how head coach Claude Lang described his East Mills girls and boys track teams heading into this season.

Lange said the talent is there to answer those questions if he can match the potential to events

"Every year I try and figure out how to win the conference, or at least finish with as many points as we possibly can, with the chess pieces we have," said Lang, who coaches both the girls and boys teams. "We want to know who gives us the best shot and what's the best combination to get points and medals."

"What it's going to come down to is who is going to be competitive and put it on the line for the team and get us points at meets. Those are the people you're trying to develop every day, every meet, every practice."

The Wolverines' boys' roster lists 25 athletes, while there are 13 girls out for this year's squad.

"We have a lot of core guys back," Lang said of his defending Corner Conference champions boys squad. "We have a few defending champs there. We're putting a lot of time in now on conditioning to get into competition shape and sort out some events."

Last season, the boys had one of the top sprinter groups in the conference, and Lang said they will again be strong there.

"The district sort of dictated that," he said. "We needed to be good there and we were. We fell a little short in hurdles. I'm not sure what the district will look like this year, but the depth is there."

The Wolverines have seven freshman boys out who have put in the time to compete this season.

"We'll see if they can make an impact in some relays or individual events; we don't know yet," he said.

Lang likes the balance of his boys squad between sprinters and distance runners.

"We have a good combination," he said.
"We should be able to put together a good track meet. We can definitely compete at the meets in our area and at some of the bigger meets, we can piece together some good relays and earn some points."

On the girls side, Lang said he lost a few upperclassmen athletes but gained a few

others.

"I think if we had everybody out, we'd have a good shot at winning the conference," he said. "I think we might be a couple girls short right now but we're still aiming to be there, scoring as many points as we can. The school record for points is 105 (at the conference meet). That is still the goal."

The Wolverines' distance medley and 4x400-meter relays both won the conference a year ago, and the bulk of those runners return.

"I'd like to see us improve on those times," he said. "And individually we do have some pretty good runners back."

Among those individual runners is Emily Williams. The junior all-conference volleyball and basketball player missed the previous few track seasons with injuries. She's 100% healthy this year, Lang said, and eager to compete and is poised for a big year.

"I just saw her at the track by herself doing some workouts," he said. "If we can remain healthy, we can be pretty good."

Lang has a handful of girls who have long and high jump experience. On the boys side, Davis McGrew returns after placing third in the long jump at the conference meet a year ago and Braden West, an allconference basketball player, is out for high jump.

"He can get up in the air," Lang said. "If we can get some good form on him, he can be exciting."

Elizabeth Albright will take over coaching the throwers. Albright is an experienced thrower herself, and Lang said it's the first time in four seasons he's had a coach that will focus on throws.

"Our throwers should all be better," he said. The Wolverines return their top boys' thrower in Sylas Allen and Jaimee Davis for the girls.

"If we can start this year anywhere near where we ended last year, we should be ok," he said.

Conditioning thus far this spring has been a work in progress. Lots of sore muscles and a few minor injuries, Lang said.

"We're not there yet; their bodies are like 'I don't like this running thing' right now," he said. "We have some tight hamstrings. But we're getting there."

Leah Sandin and Abby Burke also return, averaging 58 and 59, respectively.


The Stanton trio is joined by Kirsten Kalkas and Hailee Barrett, both of Essex, for their debut season.


Dylan Barrett tops the list of returnees with a ninehole average of 48 from a year ago on the varsity team.

team was plagued by injuries and illnesses for the six athletes out. This season, the team has doubled in size and hopefully, will have enough to on the team to compete in more meets.


Alex Hartman returns as the lead sprinter, and Tosh Feltner was the Tiger tosser last season, competing in both the shot put and the discus.


