AMES, IA - The 6th Annual Iowa Rural Summit last week included a special recognition of "rural heroes" - and Stanton businessman/community leader Mickey Anderson was one of the seven individuals honored at a special reception at Iowa State University. The Rural Summit brings together leaders from small towns across Iowa each year, and this year's event included a special tribute to a group of individuals

who have made a difference in their rural community or region. The event also recognized the contributions of Rand Fisher, the recently retired Iowa Area Development Group CEO. The Rand Fisher Rural Leadership Award, sponsored by the IADG Community Foundation, recognized individuals in the rural economic and community development, philanthropy, the arts and utilities.

"Mickey was selected for his impact in Stanton and throughout Montgomery County over many years," said Mark Reinig, board chairman of the Iowa Rural Development Council (IRDC) which hosts the annual Rural Summit. "His work shows how small towns can thrive through great leadership and innovative projects." With a crowd of more than 360 individuals from 70 different small towns (including Stanton and Red Oak), the Iowa Rural Summit addressed issues ranging from ag tech innovation to arts and culture to entrepreneurship.

Other honorees included Chris Deal, Jefferson; Maureen Elbert, Algona; Deb Lucht, Minburn; Joe Sorenson, Des Moines, and Jim and Julie Vermeer, Spencer.
