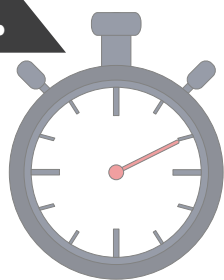

Red Oak boys and girls tennis teams begin post season play this week after the conference tournaments played last week.

Red Oak hosted the Hawkeye 10 boys tennis tournament on Monday and Tuesday instead of the usual one-day tournament, due to weather.

As a team, the Tigers finished with five points for ninth place.

"This was a good improvement from last season as we finished in last place of the conference with

only one point," Red Oak head boys tennis coach Tristin Johnson said. "The boys competed well and fought tough during the two-day tournament. We will continue to work and get better for districts on Monday."

The Red Oak track team competed in the Hawkeye 10 track meet in Atlantic on Thursday, May 5, where the Tiger boys swept the conference medleys.

“I think we are buttoned up and ready for state qualifying,” Red Oak head boys track coach Sueann French said.

The sprint medley relay won and ran their best time of the season in 1:36.45. The relay consisted of Luke Sayonkon, Landon Couse, Riley Fouts, and Jack Kling.

The distance medley took first place in a time of 3:45 (Couse, Fouts, Aiden Bruce, Baylor Bergren); and Bergren hit a personal best in the 3200m, finishing with a time of 10:01 for third place.

Kling earned gold in the 400m in a time of 51.10.

The Tigers finished with 62 points.

After winning the home opener against Creston last Tuesday, the Red Oak soccer team traveled to Atlantic on Thursday, May 5 and came away victorious 2-0.

During the opening stages of the game, the Tigers controlled the ball on Atlantic's half of the field and scored in the first five minutes from a throw in from Heath Jackson to Brandon Hernandez. Connor Britten found the back of the net as the Trojan goal keeper was out of position.

The Tigers added another goal from Alex Vera in the middle of the first half to give Red Oak a 2-0 lead going into the halftime.

Landon Gigstad had a great game, facing six shots on goal, but maintaining a clean sheet for the game.

Timberwolves track boys finish 4th in POI

The Southwest Valley boys track team finished tied for fourth in the Pride of Iowa Conference co-ed track meet held in Mount Ayr on Tuesday, May 3. “This is one of the highest finishes we have had in the conference in recent memory,” SWV head boys track coach Allen Naugle said. “Overall, I thought we took a big step forward tonight with a lot of guys and events improving their season best times.”

SWV track teams will compete in Tabor on Thursday, May 12 in the state qualifying meet, along with East Mills, Essex, and Stanton, beginning at 4:30 p.m.

92.02 RATES FOR SERVICE. Water service shall be furnished at the following monthly rates within the City: (*Code of Iowa, Sec. 384.84*)

1. Basic Charge shall be \$7.98 to be charged on all bills.

2. From 0 to 4,000 cubic feet used per month, @ \$2.74 per 100 cubic feet.

3. Over 4,000 cubic feet used per month, @ \$2.10 per 100 cubic feet.

SECTION II. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE.

If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION III. WHEN EFFECTIVE

SUPERVISOR'S MINUTES
Tuesday, April 26, 2022

The Montgomery County Board of Supervisors met in quorum on Tuesday, April 26, 2022, at 8:00 a.m. at the courthouse for their regular meeting. The meeting was called to order by Chair Mark Peterson. There was a roll call of members with Supervisors: Randy Cooper, Mike Olson, Mark Peterson, Donna Robinson and Charla Schmid present.

Motion to approve the agenda by Olson, seconded by Cooper. Roll call: Yes: Olson, Peterson, Cooper, Robinson, Schmid. No: None. Motion carried.

Minutes of the April 19, 2022, regular meeting were approved and stand as read.

Tom Schuertz of Alera Group was present via zoom. He distributed health insurance renewal rates with a cost sharing analysis. He stated that there is an 8% increase. He shared three scenarios and evaluated the

reserve fund impact. There are no changes to the health care plan designs. The Board discussed reducing the rates by spending down some of the reserve fund.

Motion by Olson, second by Schmid to approve renewal at the 4% increase by utilizing the self-fund budget. Roll call: Yes: Peterson, Cooper, Robinson, Schmid, Olson. No: None. Motion carried.

The Chairman called for public comments. There were none.

Larry Brandstetter of the Montgomery County Recreational Trails Organization was present. He shared that the organization is a non-profit made up of board members from Red Oak, Stanton, and Villisca. Brandstetter informed the Supervisors that there is federal money and TAP money available to develop trails. He said that a feasibility study needs to be completed before applying for the grants. The group secured bids from two engineering firms to complete

the study consisting of two routes. The lowest bid was in the amount of \$15,000. Brandstetter asked the Board for their support and made the request for Montgomery County to pay for the study out of ARPA funds.

Robinson asked if other entities have been asked to help with the expense. He answered that they asked Iowa West Foundation, but they were not able to secure funding from them. No other entities have been approached.

Robinson stated that she felt the \$15,000 should come from the general county budget through Montgomery County Economic Development rather than ARPA funds. She explained that the Board has not opened the ARPA requests externally. The consensus of the Board was in favor of the project and there needs to be more discussion on where the funding would come from. Auditor Burke shared that a budget amendment will be scheduled for May, and the Board can go over the current budget at their next board

meeting and make a decision then.

Veterans Affairs Director, Harry Rossander, was present. He introduced Curtis White as the new Veterans Affairs Director. He will be starting May 2. Motion by Schmid, second by Cooper to accept the recommendation from the Veterans Affairs Commission to hire Curtis White. Roll call: Yes: Cooper, Robinson, Schmid, Olson, Peterson. No: None. Motion carried.

Under Supervisor's updates, Robinson shared with the Board that she has reached out to a couple of counties about hiring an inspection firm for the potential pipeline. Page County responded that they only signed a letter of intent and there will be no payments made until the actual project starts. Olson attended a Juvenile Detention meeting. Peterson attended a Conservation meeting. Cooper attended a Red Oak Chamber meeting.

Under Secondary Roads update, Engineer Albert updated the Board on maintenance and projects.

Under new business, motion by Schmid, second by Cooper to approve claims payable on Wednesday, April 27, 2022, in the amount of \$1,124,312.69. Robinson stated her concern with claims under Veteran's Affairs. She noticed that Rossander attended a Spring Conference a couple of weeks prior to his last day of employment, and the expenses of that were in the amount of \$698.82. She questioned why an employee would spend money to go to a conference so close to their last date of employment with the County. She suggested the possibility of putting a policy in place to avoid that in the future. Roll call: Yes: Cooper, Olson, Peterson, Robinson, Schmid. No: None. Motion carried.

Under announcements, the next regular board meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, May 3, 2022, at 8:30 a.m. Agenda items discussed were the public hearing scheduled for 8:45 a.m. to classify portion of 230th Street

to Level C, budget amendment discussion and schedule public hearing for FY 21-22 budget amendment and trail funding request. Auditor Burke shared that Montgomery County will be participating in Leadership Red Oak on May 5 at the Courthouse. She distributed a sign-up sheet for the Supervisors.

At 9:10 a.m., motion by Olson, second by Robinson to enter into closed session pursuant to Iowa Code 21.5(C). Roll call: Yes: Olson, Peterson, Robinson, Schmid, Cooper. No: None. Motion carried.

At 9:46 a.m., the Board came out of closed session.

Street to the Tarkio Creek, then follow the Tarkio Creek north to 210th Street, then east on 210th Street to P Avenue, then south on P Avenue to 250th Street, then west on 250th Street to L Avenue, then south on L Avenue to the Page-Montgomery County line, then west along the Page-Montgomery County line to the point of beginning.

Precinct Seven: Point of beginning: Intersection of Page-Montgomery County line and L Avenue, then north on L Avenue to 250th Street, then east on 250th Street to P Avenue, then north on P Avenue to 210th Street, then west on 210th Street to O Avenue, then north on O Avenue to 160th Street, then east on 160th Street to Adams-Montgomery County line, then south along the Adams-Montgomery County line to the Page-Montgomery County line, then west along the Page-Montgomery County line to the point of beginning.

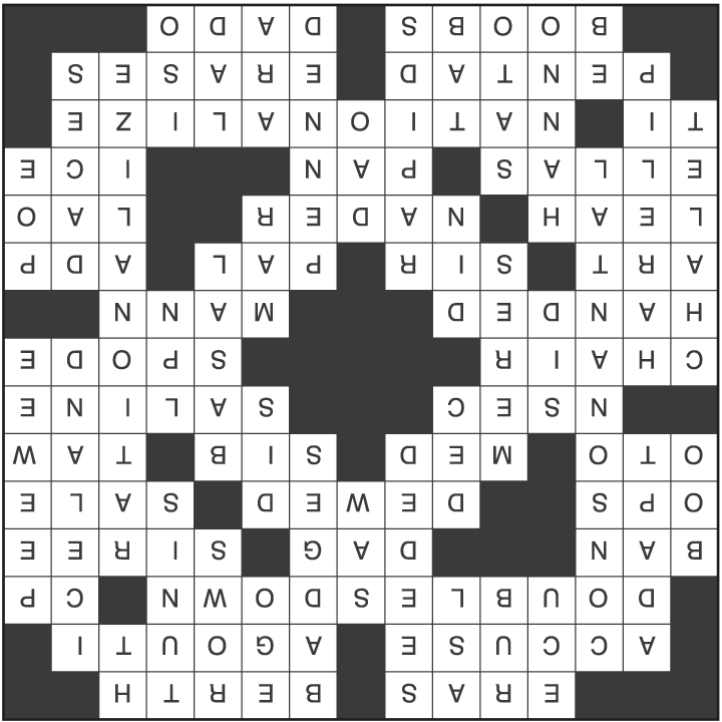

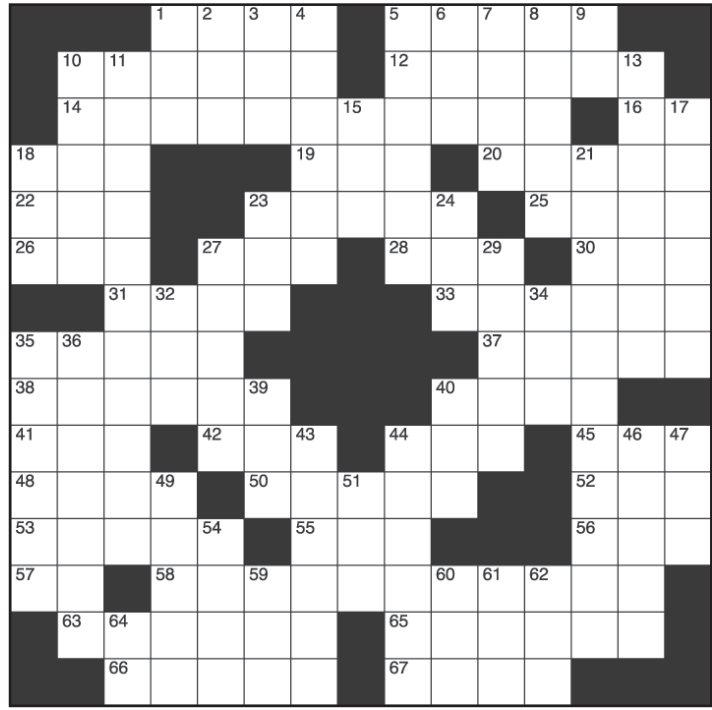

The City of Red Oak paid tribute to a longtime community leader, Steve Roberts. At a special ceremony, the ball-field near Chautauqua Park was dedicated as the Steve Roberts Memorial Field. Roberts served for many years as Police Chief in the Red Oak Community. Red Oak Mayor Bill Billings said the dedication of the field was two-fold: to recognize Roberts for his long dedication to the community as police chief and for his dedication to the game of baseball. Roberts was very involved in the Red Oak Red Sox program.	Jerry Gilliland was named the 2012 recipient of the Stanton Ole award for community service. He was presented the award by 2011 recipient Don Hicks. Gilliland said he was surprised by the selection and was honored to join the list of the previous recipients. Gilliland, a 1962 graduate of Northwest Missouri State with an education degree, spent all but three years of his teaching career with the Stanton School District as a math instructor and as coach for a number of different sports within the district. He retired from teaching in 1998.	Although the Red Oak School Facilities Committee saw a potential bond issue defeated for a second time, the organization remained undaunted. The bond issue vote needed a 60% majority to pass, and Chair Julie Rubey said the group was pleased to see that the vote moved up to nearly 50% in favor of the bond issue. She said that bond issue votes normally take a few tries before they pass. When the final votes were tallied, 48.03% of the voters were in favor of the bond issue being passed.	Despite unfavorable weather, a group of more than 200 Optimist Club members from Red Oak, Villisca, and Glenwood, and their families, had a two-hour Missouri River trip and picnic on the Belle of Brownville riverboat. The group boarded the ship in Bellevue. The party included a total of 60 children and their families, who were special guests of the Optimist Club for the event. Dave England was the coordinator for the special Optimist event.

"He trusts the process and showed a lot of improvement

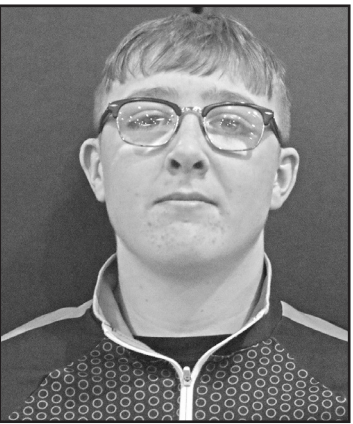
scoring some points and winning some positions," Tieggen Podliska said.
