Blue Oval success

The Red Oak track teams competed in eight events at the state track and field meet in Des Moines at Drake University over the three day event and brought home three medals, including a runner-up medal in the Class 2A sprint medley relay.

"I am super proud of the effort the three days we had at state track," Red Oak head boys track coach Sueann French said. "The highlight was breaking a 50-year-old school record that's been held since 1973 in the 4X100. The old record was 43.33. Another highlight was getting second place in the sprint medley relay with another PR of 1:33.57. Jack Kling placing fourth in the 400m was also a PR."

The sprint medley team consisted of Landon Couse, Riley Fouts, Brayden Sifford, and Jack Kling, and they ran 1:33.57 for second place.

Red Oak's Kling finished fourth in the 400m and Jocelyn O'Neal finished fourth in the long jump, both bringing home hardware. Kling's time was 50.53, and O'Neals' leap was 17-03.75, a personal best.

Kling placed ninth, just one place shy of qualifying for the finals, in the 200m preliminaries with a time of 22.80.

Sifford finished 21st in the 100m preliminaries with a time of 11.53.

"I am super proud of the guys, and we will surely miss the seniors," French said. Freshman O'Neal finished 11th in the

400m with a personal record time of 1:00.71. The 4X200 Tiger relay team was disqualified in the preliminaries, while the $4\bar{X}100$ relay finished third in the preliminaries in a time of 43.46. They took that into the finals and finished third, lowering their time to a

season best and school record 43.07. "Jocelyn had an excellent meet as a freshman setting new personal records on the biggest high school track stage," Red Oak head girls track coach Curt Adams said. "I already can't wait for next year."

Stanton

The Stanton girls competed in the shuttle hurdle relay, 4X100, and long jump. The shuttle hurdle team of Addi Olson, Lauren Johnson, Elly McDonald, and Hannah Olson finished fourth in the preliminaries with a 1:08.59, and ran to a first-place championship in a time of 1:07.26 in the finals. This is the first ever girls relay state championship for Stanton.

The 4X100 relay of Brooklyn Silva,

finished 14th in Class 1A with a season best of 11.71. time of 51.97.

Stanton sophomore L. Johnson placed 16th in the long jump with a leap of 15-07.25. The Stanton boys shuttle hurdle relay team was disqualified in the preliminaries. **East Mills**

Emma had a tremendous season, and although it didn't end the way she wanted it to at the state meet, she had many accomplishments this year to be proud of. She had set goals at the beginning of the season to jump 17 feet, win the conference, and return to state. She accomplished all three of those. I am very proud of her and her effort and attitude all season long, and look forward to seeing what she can do her senior season."

Rebekah Topham, a 2015 Griswold graduate was inducted into the IGHSAU Track and Field Hall of Fame on Saturday, May 20, at the state track and field meet at Drake.

Topham finished her high school career with 11 state titles, four second-place finishes, and 16 state medals

Topham was a distance runer, and claimed titles in the 1500m all four years of high school. She is one of five runners in the state to win the 800m, 1500m, and 3000m in the same meet twice, and one of two runners to win teh 800m, 1500m, 3000m, and 400 hurdles in the same meet. She

is the only female runner to win four state championships in cross country. Topham also claimed titles at the Drake Relays, winning the 1500m

and 3000m as a freshman.

She continued to run in college, competing at Wichita State, where she won seven indoor Missouri Valley Conference championships and three outdoor titles. She won the university

division at Drake Relays in te 1500m

in as a freshman and again as a junior,

and finished second in the steeple-chase in 2018.

Topham ranks second on the Witchita Shockers' all-time list in the indoor 3000m, and third in the indoor mile and 5000m.





lowing: CHAPTER 124 'MOBILE FOOD VENDORS"

124.01 DEFINITIONS.
"MOBILE FOOD VENDOR": A person engaged in the business of selling food or beverages from a mobile food unit or a pushcart.

"MOBILE FOOD UNIT": A selfcontained motorized vehicle or trailer that is equipped for selling food and/ or beverages from non-permanent dining locations.
"PUSHCART": A pushcart is a non-

motorized vehicle with dimensions not exceeding 4 feet in width and 8 feet in length and 8 feet in height and being capable of being moved and kept under control by one person traveling

124.02 MOBILE FOOD VENDOR LICENSE REQUIRED. It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in the sale of food or bev-

erages from a mobile food vendor without first obtaining a mobile food vendor license. A mobile food vendor license issued by the city clerk or the city clerk's designee shall be subject to the following: A. A mobile food vendor license is

either an annual license, a 6-month license, or a 1-day license that expires on the day for which it is issued, sixmonths from the day in which it is issued, or no later than December 31st of each year.
B. Each mobile food vendor shall

be permitted separately. No permit transfer is allowed.

C. Each mobile food unit shall comply with State of Iowa inspection requirements and display its state license in full view of the public in or on the unit. D. Each mobile food unit shall have

a working fire suppression system.

124.03. MOBILE FOOD VENDOR

PERMIT APPLICATION: A. Filing: Application requests shall be filed with city hall. No application request shall be accepted for filing and processing unless it conforms to the requirements of this chapter. This would include a complete and true application that includes all of the required materials and information prescribed and is accompanied by the

required fees.

B. Timely Submittal: The city reserves the right to reject any applications that have not been timely submitted to the city. C. Application Contents: Application

shall be made on a form provided by the city and shall include: Full name of the applicant. 2. Applicant's contact information,

numbers and e-mail address. 3. Photographs of the mobile food unit from the front, side and back. 4. Make, model, and year of vehicle

including mailing address, phone

to be used and the license plate number (if required). 5. Overall size of the vehicle; to

include length, width, and height 6. Proof of a valid state food selling

7. Proof that the applicant has earned ServSafe Manager certifica-

8. Proof of liability insurance D. Right to Appeal: Any applicant whose application for license was disapproved may appeal to the City Council at its next regularly scheduled meeting by filing with the city clerk or the city clerk's designee a written request for an appeal to the City Council at least seven (7) days prior to the meeting. As a result of this appeal, the City Council may affirm modify or reverse the decision of the clerk not to issue the license. If the application for license is denied, the applicant is not eligible for the issuance of a license under this chapter for a period of one year from the date of notification that the license application was disapproved, was served in person or deposited in U.S. mail.

E. Applications Deemed Withdrawn: Any application received shall be deemed withdrawn if it has been held in abeyance, awaiting the submittal of additional requested information from the applicant, and if the applicant has not communicated in writing with the city and made reasonable progress within thirty (30) days from the last notification from the city to the applicant. The application fee is nonrefundable. Any application deemed withdrawn shall require submission of a new application and fees to begin a new review and approval process.

F. Issuance of Permit: Upon completion of the review process and a determination of compliance with the applicable regulations, the city clerk or the city clerk's designee will issue a mobile food unit permit

124.04 MOBILE FOOD VENDOR LOCATIONS.

A. Mobile Food Units On Public Property: A mobile food unit (nonpushcart) may be parked on public property or street (on a non-residential side) as approved in the licensing application or as part of a city approved event under a public property special event permit issued by the special event organizer (ie. Chamber of Commerce). Mobile food units may not park within a city park, greenway, or any other parking and access area. Mobile units also are prohibited from parking within 100 feet of any facade or outdoor seating of a ground level establishment that sells prepared food or beverages (this only applies from one hour before the establishment's opening to an hour after closing) without approval from the food establishment owner.

B. Pushcarts are permitted to operate within city parks, walkway or greenways as well as private property (with property owner approval) However, a minimum forty-eight inch (48") open walkway must be maintained for passing pedestrians. The placement of the pushcart shall be in such a manner so as to minimize encroachment into the forty-eight inch (48") walkway by patrons waiting in line for service from the pushcart. Requests for authorization to vend within a city park or greenway (not as part of a city permitted public property special event) may be submitted no less than five (5) days and no more than fifteen (15) days prior to the requested day of vending.

C. No Mobile Food Unit shall be left unattended or stored on any site overnight, unless that property is under the ownership or control of (by way of a lease or other contractual agreement) the operator of the unit and is being done so in compliance with all other city code requirements or the mobile food unit is a participant in a multiple (contiguous) day, city permitted, public property special event. Any mobile food unit found unattended shall be considered in violation of these regulations and subject to license revocation, towing, or any

other action legally allowed. D. Music and Sound Making Devices: The use of music or sound making devices as a part of a mobile food unit shall be prohibited, unless expressly allowed as part of an approved event

E. Mobile Food Unit Performance Standards: Persons conducting business from a mobile food unit must do so in compliance with the following standards: 1. The mobile food vendor must ob-

tain expressed written consent of the property owner or lessee to use the property on which they propose to operate or from the City if a pushcart on public property. The written consent must be kept in the unit at all times that the unit is on the property. Written consent does not excuse or permit the violation of any other imposable

regulations. 2. The operator of the mobile food unit shall display their city license in full view of the public in or on the unit. 3. Mobile food units that are within three hundred feet (300') of a residential use or residentially zoned property, shall be limited to hours of operation between seven o'clock (7:00) A.M. and ten o'clock (10:00)

4. Mobile food units shall serve patrons which are on foot only; no drive-up service to the unit itself shall be provided or allowed. 5. The mobile food unit (non-pushcart) must be located on a paved or rocked surface.

6. No mobile food unit may be located on a vacant property or lot with a vacant building. Exceptions to this rule may be granted by city clerk after a review of the particular property and the vendor has been able to maké arrangements to ensure safe and sanitary conditions. This would include, but is not limited to: adequate access for fire and police personnel/ vehicles, and that the site in general is free from hazards or dangerous

7. All mobile food units shall maintain a minimum separation from buildings of ten feet as measured to the closest building element including awnings or canopies, tents or membrane structures. Location of the food unit shall not impede pedestrians entering or exiting a building.

8. The window or area where a patron orders and receives their purchase shall be located so as to not require a patron to stand, or create a line that may cause pedestrians to be in the public right of way, vehicle travel lane, including parking lot drive aisles, or similar situation that may create a potential safety hazard. Adequate safe space for patrons waiting for their order must be available on the property where the mobile food unit is located.

9. Signs on a mobile food unit are to be attached to the exterior of the mobile unit and must be mounted flat against the unit and not project more than six inches (6") from the exterior of the unit. Any freestanding signs, banners, flags, or similar items may be permitted within five feet (5') of said mobile food unit, provided, however, that they may not infringe on the space of any other mobile food unit that is properly situated in compliance with the provisions of this ordinance and the terms of any permit issued. Off premises signs directing patrons to the mobile food unit are prohibited.

10. During business hours, the mobile food vendor shall provide a trash receptacle for use by customers and shall keep the area around the mobile food unit clear of litter and debris at

11. All mobile food units shall be located in such a manner as to not create a safety hazard, such as blocking emergency access to buildings and the site, obstructing access to fire hydrants, impeding entering and exiting from a building, creating a visual impediment for the motoring public at drive entrances, intersections, pedestrian crossings, or similar movement and access.

124.05 PROPERTY OWNER/LES-SEE RESPONSIBILITY.

By allowing the mobile food unit on their property, the property owner or lessee jointly and severally with the vendor are responsible for compliance with this chapter and to ensure the safety of pedestrians and access of emergency vehicles to and around the site. Failure to do so could result in the property owner or lessee being party to any enforcement actions or penalties allowed by law.

124.06 PERMIT FEES. 
