Less stress? More free time? Me smiling more and less intimidating? I’m not sure but the players are much more talkative and I enjoy being around them.

This season, I am making new friends with Ashley and Brinkly. A little bit of sass; a little bit of sweet. So far, they have made me laugh hard enough my side has started to hurt. Laughing develops abs ... no off-season for me either!

What a charmed life it is!

Classic family hobby

Sometimes the generation gap causes strife and confusion among family members. Not so with the Bill Morris family. Bill and his wife Linda, their daughter Kym and husband Gary, and their grandson Rebel all have something in common: cars. Especially classic cars. More specifically, Studebakers.

The three generations traveled to South Bend, Indiana for their second Studabaker International meet the first weekend of May. This year it rained the entire time, but it did not dampen the experience.

“It rained the entire time, and there was not a good photo location; no back-drop or banner,” Gary Thoren said. “We ended up just taking the Avanti, which made it out and back with no problems. The car scored second place in class, and we were able to pick up some parts.”

The Avanti (pictured above) is a maroon 1967, and is Bill’s car. His first car was a 1951 Studebaker Starlight Coup, and that was the car he had when he was courting his now-wife, Linda.

“I always thought it looked like a bird,” Linda said. “So, I called it the bird.”

The Avanti made the 1,060 round trip in the rain, was the second car judged on the second day, and placed second in class.

“The points deducted were water drops on the taillights and dirt on the undercarriage of the car,” Gary said. “The car was up against other cars that were trailered in and never saw a drop of rain or a road. Bill would rather place second and enjoy the ride than trailer it and get best in class. This car made the round trip in rain and performed flawlessly.”

Bill has restored cars since his retire-

ment 15 years ago. Before that, he would buy Ford Broncos and modify them to climb mountains in Colorado. Kym began working on them with her dad when she was about 15 years old. Rebel, 12 years old, has worked on them for as long as he can remember.

“I scraped the underside of the Champion,” Rebel said. “I like working on the cars, but I don’t like the gravel falling inside my eyes and on my face.”

Rebel has been featured in Turning Wheels, the official publication of the Studebaker Drivers Club, and so has his dad. All three generations are members of the club and belong to the Hawkeye Chapter.

Bill loves to drive his classic cars, and not just around town.

“I’m not afraid to drive them,” Bill said. “Just get in and drive. What’s the point if you don’t enjoy driving them? And it’s fun to see the looks on people’s faces when they do a double take and see an old man in an old car.”

Bill has driven his 1952 Commander to Wilmington, North Carolina. And as mentioned earlier, they drove the Avanti to South Bend.

Kym’s favorite car is the Champion, while Rebel prefers the Marlin. Bill is an Avanti guy and Gary said, “If you are talking a car of the Studebaker flavor, I would have to say my Hawk.”

“I think the Avanti looks like it is driving backwards,” Kym said.

Gary agreed and explained, “That’s because there is no grill on the front.”

Bill bought a 1947 Commander just for parts.

“It had been sitting since 1971,” Bill said with a grin. “I tore the engine apart, pulled the cylinder head off, and got it running.”

This classic hobby has drawn the family close, and they would always choose a garage night over a game night.

Plankton

They may be teensy, tiny little things, but plankton are hugely important!

They are hard to see, but these tiny living things in the ocean are important to our entire planet. They are food for many sea creatures. And they make much of the oxygen we breathe.

The word plankton comes from the Greek word planktos, which means "drifter." Their name fits because plankton do not swim on their own. Instead, they drift through water. When the water moves, they move with it.

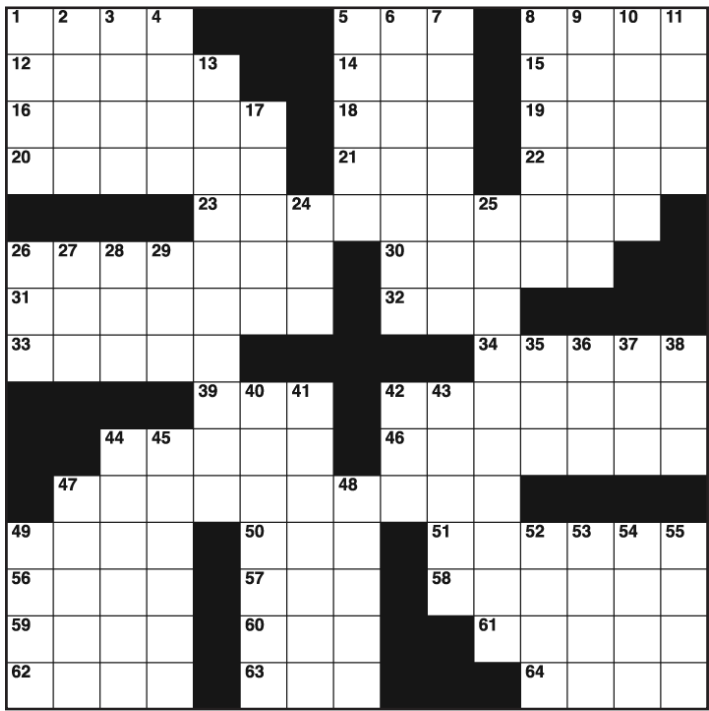

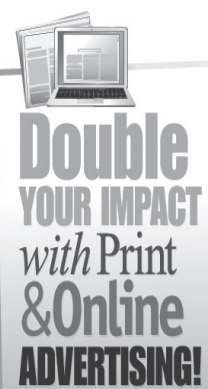
