RO's Couse, Lindsay hit first career HR

Jaydin Lindsay and Landon Couse each hit a home run for the first time in their prep careers on Monday, June 27, against Denison.

Tiger softball dropped the first game 13-1 in three innings. Lindsay's solo home run was the lone hit for the Tigers. Nicole Bond pitched two innings and Emily Sebeniecher pitched 1/3 of an inning in the loss.

The Tigers fell 12-0 in four innings in the second game. Sebeniecher pitched three innings. Tori Wendt had the solo hit for the Tigers.

Tiger baseball split wins with the Monarchs, dropping game one 5-3.

Dawson Bond started on the mound and pitched four innings allowing seven hits and four earned runs. He walked one and struck out eight. Braden Woods pitched two innings allowing one hit. He walked two and struck out three.

"We started a little sluggish and couldn't put together the at bats we needed to early on to make this one a little tighter," Red Oak head baseball coach Mark Erickson said. "Credit to the Denison hitters as they were barreling up a good pitcher in Dawson."




Stanton (4-20) fell 15-6 to CAM (15-9).


