Tiger FB remains undefeated

For the first time in 51 years, the Red Oak Tiger football team begins the season 4-0 after a 47-0 rout of rival Shenandoah in district play on Friday, Sept. 16, in a homecoming victory. The Tigers have yet to be scored on with their stout defense making a statement which includes limiting the opponents' offense to 522 yards combined.

"Our defense is just built different," Red Oak head

football coach Michael Nordeen said. "We take a lot of chances and use our speed to fly around. The shutouts have continued to increase their confidence and drive them to new heights."

"It was a wonderful homecoming under the Friday night lights," Nordeen said. "The crowd was huge and loud; it was one of the best atmospheres I have ever seen on a Friday night."

The Tigers got off to a shaky start with a fumble, but two plays later Tiger Jack Kling intercepted a Mustang pass and the Tigers regained possession of the ball. A Landon Couse TD run was called back, but the Tigers capitalized with a Dawson Bond two-yard TD run.

Red Oak led 6-0 after the first quarter, and took a 30-6 lead into the break, gaining three rushing TDs by Riley Fouts and one receiving TD from Bond. Fouts added a pick six in the third quarter and another rushing TD in the fourth while the Tiger defense held the Mustangs to just 85 total yards for the final score.


"We preach a short memory, next play and our guys preach that to each other also," Nordeen said of the abundance of penalties. "We do many things as a program to build positive characteristics in our players and staff. If you can trust your brother on the field and believe in what we are aiming to accomplish, it makes it easier to forget that last play and move on."
