

Red Oak VB drops regional heartbreaker

Red Oak volleyball closed out the season 22-16 at home on Monday, Oct. 17, as they fell to Clarinda (16-15) 3-2 in a Class 3A region 3 match.

The five-set classic began in Red Oak's favor as the Tigers battled through eight knots and five lead changes for the 25-22 win in the first set. But the momentum shifted early in the second set and the Cardinals fought through eight ties for the 26-24 win.

In the third set, Red Oak's Alexis Wallace and Lainey DeVries served behind a 5-1 run each, but the Cardinals again won 25-23. Red Oak did not give up and appeared to wear the Cardinals down in the fourth set, earning a 25-

18 win behind a 7-0 run with Wallace again behind the service line.

The race to 15 was knotted five times through the 11th point, but the Cardinals used a 4-1 run to finish the set and win the match 15-12.

Stanton defeated West Harrison (4-22) 3-0; Westwood (18-16) 3-0; then fell to Riverside (31-5) 3-2 in the Class 1A region 1 semi final, ending the season 30-9.

The Viqueens began the regional season with a win over West Harrison on Monday, Oct. 17, at home. All 15 members of the team were able to get playing time in the three set win with scores of 25-10, 25-12, 25-12.

"The team did a nice job focusing on their serve in the match," Stanton head volleyball coach Jody Druivenga said. "Three players all had four or more aces on the evening."

"The setters continue to do a nice job moving the ball around to the multiple hitters, and I think we are doing a better job of seeing the court and making great decisions on where to place our hitters," Druivenga said. "Overall, it was a good win for the team and fun to be on the regional trail for this season."

With the win, the Queens advanced to a quarterfinal against Westwood on Wednesday, Oct. 19, at home and won 3-1 with set scores of 21-25, 25-20, 25-19, 28-26.

"We really did not know much about Westwood nor had we seen or played them this season," Druivenga said. "It was a suspenseful match as they came out strong and took set one, and we battled back and forth to win the next three sets."

The Rebels led the entire

first set with the Viqueens getting as close as a one-point deficit, but they could not get ahead. From there on out, Stanton was able to battle to victory.

"Every serve was a fight for a point on the scoreboard," Druivenga said. "Westwood was very scrappy and we really had to work on seeing the open spots and take advantage of every side out. We were very happy with how the team remained composed when we were neck and neck with Westwood at the end of set four. The girls focused on each point, and I feel that helped them remain calm and poised in that position."

With the match being tied at one each, the teams battled back and forth all three of the following sets.

Stanton held a comfortable lead in set three, leading by as much as five points at one time, but Riverside held a late 5-0 rally for the comeback 27-25 win.

Again in the fourth set, Stanton took an early 9-4 lead, but saw the Bulldogs keep chipping away before an 11-2 run put Riverside in the lead at 21-20. The Queens finished the set in the win column with

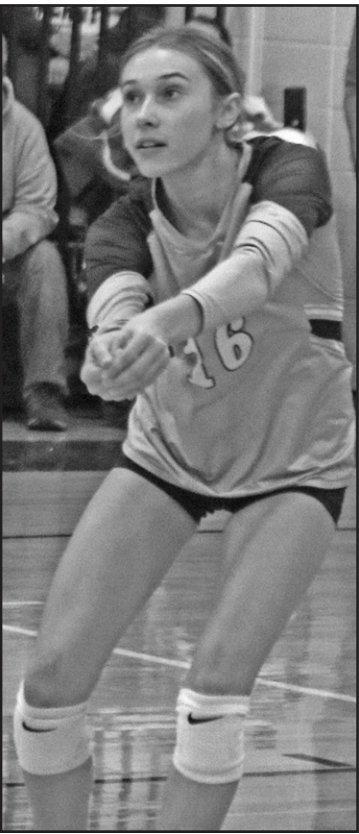

As Madrid was making its final run, SWV's Robbie Barnes got a strip sack which was recovered by Devin Greenwalt, and the Timberwolves were able to get into victory formation for two downs to secure the win.

The two teams met up in district play during the regular season on Friday, Sept. 9, with AHSTW earning a 28-0 win.

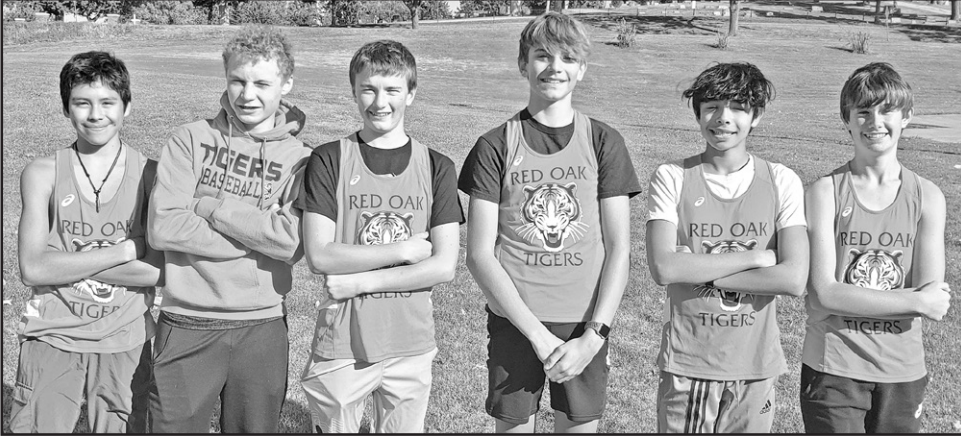

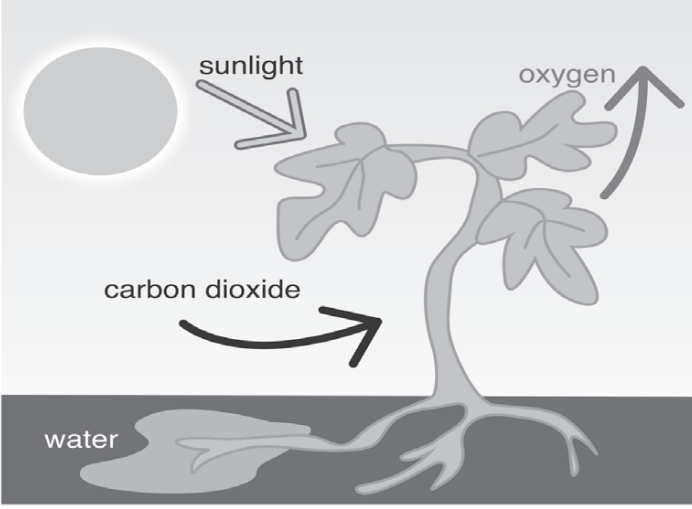

Plants make food in a process called **photosynthesis**. During summer, plants take water up from their roots to their leaves. They absorb **carbon dioxide** from the air. These combine to make **chlorophyll** which makes plant leaves green.

Large field fire on A Avenue

On Sunday, Oct. 23, the Montgomery County Communications Center received multiple 9-1-1 calls at 4:47 p.m. reporting a small ditch fire in the area of Highway 34 and A Avenue. Mutual aid was requested immediately prior to any fire units arriving on scene due to wind conditions. Once fire crews arrived on scene, the fire grew rapidly and spread quickly north to adjoining fields. Several homes in the area were evacuated by law enforcement and mutual aid was again requested from numerous area fire departments. Without the quick response of all of the first responders and area farmers who contributed with tractors and discs, this fire would have traveled for several more miles, consumed many more acres and endangered several homes and lives in the process. No homes were destroyed and only two minor injuries were reported as a result of the fire. It is believed that the fire originated from a previous fire two weeks ago as a result of strong winds. As of Monday morning, Oct. 24, there are several sections within the area that have trees and other debris burning. It is believed that roughly 750 acres were consumed by fire. Eighteen fire departments, six law enforcement agencies, three EMA, three county dispatch agencies and more than 12 farmers with tractors and discs helped with the fire.

House fire on Prospect in Red Oak

Around 1:58 a.m. on Sunday, Oct. 23, members of the Red Oak Fire Department were dispatched to 907 E Prospect St. in Red Oak, for a reported house fire. Upon arrival, the entire front of the 2 1/2 story residence was on fire. Fire was extending from the first floor through the residence into the attic space.

Mutual aid was called upon and received by Stanton, Elliott and Essex. There were four occupants at the time of the fire, who all evacuated prior to the fire department's arrival. Unfortunately, some pets did perish in the fire, and a couple of the residents were evaluated by EMS for smoke inhalation. No injuries were reported to firefighters. The fire was under control by 5:56 a.m. The home is owned by Windy Monjarez. The fire remains under investigation.

Burn ban in Montgomery, Page Counties

An open burn ban has been issued for both Montgomery County and Page County effective immediately. The ban prohibits all open and controlled burning in Montgomery and Page County unless an official burn ban permit has been issued by the proper fire chief. The open burn ban was approved unanimously by all fire chiefs in both counties. Citizens are reminded to not throw out cigarettes from moving vehicles and to discontinue burning yard waste, piled tree debris, grass/agricultural ground and set-asides or other items during this ban. Small recreational camp fires are permitted only if they are conducted in a fire place of brick, metal or heavy one-inch wire mesh. Any camp fire not in an outdoor fire place is prohibited. Violation of a burn ban can subject a person to citation or arrest for reckless use of fire or disobeying a burn ban.
